## **RULES – Horticultural and Domestic Sections**

1. **Every Exhibitor in the Open Classes** must, if called upon, sign a declaration that the exhibits have been grown in his or her own garden or allotment, and no professional gardener is allowed to compete in the Amateur Classes. The Committee reserve the right to inspect gardens.
2. **Marquee** to be open from 7.30am to 10.00am for Exhibitors. **Judging** to commence at 10.00am prompt. **All Exhibitors are kindly asked to leave the Marquee when they have staged their exhibits.**
3. **Exhibitors must supply their own plates, baskets or vases for the display of their entries. EXHIBITS MUST NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 4.30pm ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW.**
4. **No third Prize** unless there are four or more entries in any class, and no third prize money except in the Children's Classes.
5. **The Committee** will not hold themselves responsible for the loss or damage to Exhibits or Exhibitor's property, however arising.
6. **Any unfair means used to obtain a Prize will forfeit all claims to prizes.**
7. **Novice Class – Domestic Craft:** for those exhibitors who have not shown before.
8. **Entries** – on official entry forms only – two included in the Schedule which can be obtained from Marshalls, Long Street, Tetbury, Glos.
9. **Entry Fees:** 20p for each Entry; Children's Classes 15p each entry. Fees to accompany entry forms in an envelope.
10. Will **ALL EXHIBITORS** please write their name and Address on an envelope with entry fees enclosed and deliver to Marshalls, Long Street, Tetbury by 12 noon on Thursday 6<sup>h</sup> August 2008. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SHOW DAY.**
11. **Prize Money** will be paid on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2008 from 3.00pm – 4.15pm by the Treasurer (in the marquee). Any prize money not claimed by 4.15pm will be forfeited for Show funds.
12. **In the event of any dispute the decision of the Committee will be final.**
